To whom it may concern,

Coastal Pulp & Paper recognizes the importance of the environment and the sustainability in our core areas, pulp and paper business. We continue to work with suppliers who offer us certification and assurances with regards to sound and sustainable forestry practices. Moreover, we will implement our best efforts to avoid trading and sourcing wood or wood fibre (herein referred to as wood) from forest activities which are:

- (a) not complying with local, national or international legislation, applying to forest related activities, in particular the following areas:
 - Forestry operations and harvesting, including biodiversity conservation, and conversion of forest to other use,
 - o management of areas with designated high environmental and cultural values,
 - o protected and endangered species, including requirement of CITES.
 - o health and labour issues relating to forestry workers,
 - indigenous peoples' property, tenure and use rights,
 - o payment of taxes and loyalties,
- (b) not complying with legislation of country of harvest relating to trade and customs, in so far as the forestry sector is concerned,
- (d) utilizing genetically modified forest organisms,
- (c) converting forest to other vegetation type including conversion of primary forests to forest plantations.
